

Sports premium allocation 2016-2017

During the past academic year we have been allocated £3333.00 pupil premium with an anticipated £4667.00 still to come into the school budget (Sept 2016).

The children have participated in an Inspirational visit to The British Institute of sports where they saw Olympic athletes preparing for Rio 2016. They saw Jessica Ennis- Hill and Nicola Adams training, as well as the Paralympic table tennis team. The children participated in athletic activities on the Olympic track and requested extra equipment for them to use outside on their return to school.

The visit cost £180 for the coach and we are awaiting the invoice for the activities.

We spent a further £899.94 on equipment linked to this visit to enable the children to sustain their interest in sport.

We spent £1575.00 on outdoor storage for the new equipment so that it was easily accessible to all children.

A further £727.88 was spent to develop our forest school accessibility.

The children have participated in workshops with Montana events around hoola hooping which also led to the purchase of extra weighted hoops for better participation by the children. This cost £610.00 including equipment.

African Ark visited the school for a dance based workshop around Rio Olympics. This was sponsored and therefore subsidised at a cost of £136.53.

The impact of the activities has been an increase in sports based activities linked to workshops during playtimes and lunchtimes. The children have been motivated to practice their skills during these times and use the equipment for physical exercise.

The total expenditure to date for 2016/17 is £4158.28
